Role Summary

The Department of Medicine at Houston Methodist Hospital seeks candidates to serve as the Director of the Division of Rheumatology. The successful candidate will provide strategic, innovative, and operational leadership and will have responsibility and accountability for the clinical and academic performance of the Division within the Department of Internal Medicine. A strong record of collaborative leadership and commitment to excellence in clinical, research, and academic service is essential. Successful candidates will have a national reputation in academic rheumatology, excellent interpersonal skills, and a record of innovative and effective administrative experience and will foster collaborative interactions with private rheumatologists, students, residents, fellows, staff, and faculty.

It is expected that candidates will qualify for appointment to the faculty at Houston Methodist Academic Institute, Weill Cornell Medical College, and Texas A&M University School of Medicine at the rank of associate or full professor. Houston Methodist Hospital faculty engage in teaching, research, and clinical inpatient and ambulatory service.

Houston Methodist Hospital is committed to expanding its reputation as a top-tier academic and patient carefocused educational and research facility. This role offers a unique opportunity to build a world-class division with the goal of earning placement in the top ten *US News and World Report* national rankings.

Duties

DIVISION OF RHEUMATOLOGY

The Rheumatology specialists of Houston Methodist Academic Medicine Associates in the Texas Medical Center are proud to offer evidence-based expertise in rheumatic diseases. With access to the most advanced medical technology and innovative research available in the Texas Medical Center, our rheumatologists provide comprehensive care in the diagnosis and treatment of a wide range of systemic autoimmune conditions and musculoskeletal diseases.

The Rheumatology Division has five full-time faculty and an ACGME-accredited rheumatology fellowship program with two first-year and two second-year fellows. Rheumatology faculty provide inpatient and outpatient clinical services at Houston Methodist. Outpatients are seen in the Houston Methodist Academic Internal Medicine Clinic, which also provides an infusion center and support staff. The Rheumatology Division is also a component of the Houston Methodist Immunology Center, which promotes clinical, educational, and research collaboration on immunologic disorders. There is robust collaboration across subspecialties of internal medicine and with surgical specialties.



INTERNAL MEDICINE AT HOUSTON METHODIST

Houston Methodist Hospital has been ranked the #1 hospital in Texas by *U.S. News and World Report* every year since the award began and is one of the top nationally ranked Honor Roll hospitals (currently #15). The Department of Medicine encompasses several nationally ranked programs, including Gastroenterology (#8), Endocrinology and Diabetes (#9), Pulmonology (#18), Geriatrics (#22), and Cancer (#29).

The Department of Medicine Service Line at Houston Methodist Hospital has approximately 780 attending physicians in 13 service lines – Allergy and Immunology, Dermatology, Emergency Medicine, Endocrinology & Diabetes, General Internal Medicine, Gastroenterology, Geriatrics, Hematology/Oncology, Hospital Medicine, Infectious Diseases, Nephrology, Pulmonary/Critical Care, and Rheumatology. Each service line elects a Clinical Service Chief, for a 3-year term, to represent their division's issues to Department and Hospital leadership.

The Academic Department of Medicine in the Physicians Organization has physicians and scientists who are clinical sub-specialists with experience as educators and investigators. Most vice-Chairs and division heads hold endowed chairs. They practice as the Methodist Academic Medicine Associates (MAMA). In 2022, MAMA generated \$52M in practice revenue and received an additional \$26M support from Houston Methodist Hospital for salaries and operations. Recruitment of an additional 20 faculty members is planned for 2023.

The Department of Medicine comprises 134 faculty with academic appointments and 118 credentialed staff. It oversees 11 programs with approximately 85 residents and fellows. These programs include an Internal Medicine residency (51 residents) and 8 ACGME fellowships in the following subspecialties: Endocrinology, Diabetes, and Metabolism (2-3 per year), Gastroenterology (4 per year), Hematology Oncology (2-3 per year), Nephrology (2 per year), Transplant Nephrology (1 per year), Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine (2-3 per year), Hospice and Palliative Care in partnership with MD Anderson (1 per year), and Rheumatology (2 per year). Additionally, the Department will offer an ACGME-accredited Infectious Diseases fellowship in 2024 and is preparing an ACGME accreditation application for an Allergy & Immunology fellowship in 2024.

Our primary academic affiliate is the top-ranked Weill Cornell Medicine, and we have affiliations with Texas A&M University, Rice University, the University of Houston, and MD Anderson Cancer Center.

Houston Methodist Hospital Foundation: The Houston Methodist Hospital Foundation helps to accomplish institutional priorities through fundraising, gift management, and stewardship. Governed by a board of directors, the Foundation accepts all gifts on the hospital's behalf and can assist in identifying donors. As a nonprofit organization, donor contributions are essential to our continued growth and success.

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Policy: Houston Methodist strives to reflect the diversity of Houston, one of the most racially and ethnically diverse cities in the country. Houston Methodist established a DEI committee of the Board of Directors, which hired Arianne D. ABOUT HOUSTON METHODIST ACADEMIC INSTITUTE

The <u>Houston Methodist Academic Institute</u> coordinates and oversees the Houston Methodist Research Institute and Houston Methodist Education Institute under the leadership of President H. Dirk Sostman, MD, FACR, Ernest Cockrell, Jr. Presidential Distinguished Chair, Edward A. Jones, President and CEO of the Research Institute, and Timothy Boone, MD, PhD, Chief Education Officer and Director of the Education Institute. The Academic Institute is advised by a council of the chairs of the academic clinical and research departments.

The Academic Institute supports Houston Methodist's *Leading Medicine* mission with an annual investment of \$264M in research and education and a planned investment of \$300M over five years for strategic academic initiatives. In 2022, investigators also had access to more than \$170M in philanthropic funds for research and education and a competitive \$28.8M philanthropic fund to support the translation of their most promising technologies. The Academic Institute has approximately 793 academic faculty and 2,270 credentialed researchers and staff who participate in over 800 clinical trials and nearly 200 animal studies.

This translational focus is accomplished by supporting the research and education teams of the Centers of Excellence, ensuring that our academic work is relevant and meets the clinical challenges and needs of our community. This patient-centered approach forms the foundation of the academic strategic focus areas of Houston Methodist.

Houston Methodist Research Institute: From its conception in 2004, the Research Institute always intended to be different from other medical research institutes. Its central objective is to conduct science in the service of medicine, using the physical connection of its 440,000-square-foot Research Institute building to the main hospital and in-house technical expertise in FDA approval pathways to streamline the process of translating laboratory research into treatments and cures for patients. The Research Institute fosters a highly collaborative environment through its vertically integrated laboratory and work spaces, 19 interdisciplinary departments, 22 research centers and programs, and participation in several collaborative centers and consortia and more than 6600 collaborations in 136 countries.

Houston Methodist Education Institute: The Education Institute provides research and clinical education experiences to more than 56,000 learners per year across multiple disciplines, including over 1,100 trainees in residence for medicine, research, nursing, pharmacy, and allied health. The Education Institute supports 67 GME programs, including 49 ACGME-accredited and 15 GMEC-sponsored programs with a total of 373 residents and fellows, and five PhD, two MD-PhD, and two master's degree programs in collaboration with other institutions.

Houston Methodist Institute for Technology, Innovation & Education: The Houston Methodist Institute for Technology, Innovation & Education (MITIESM) is a 35,000-square-foot virtual hospital and hands-on clinical training facility for health care professionals seeking to maintain excellent procedural skills and acquire new proficiencies. MITIESM employs advanced simulators, technical trainers, robotics, and image guidance devices to enable cutting-edge surgical training in a safe and effective environment.

Restorative Medicine: Houston Methodist extends the traditional goal of medicine from fixing the damage or deterioration of the body to include a full health plan that preserves good health, addresses the collateral damage and side effects of disease and treatments, and restores the body to a state of optimal health. The objective of research in this area is to help patients maintain their optimal physical and cognitive health profiles by developing new technologies and health plans to preserve, regenerate and rejuvenate the tissues and movement that are impaired due to injury, disease, or the normal aging process.

Center For Health Data Science & Analytics: The Center for Health Data Science & Analytics (HDSA) is a data service center that brings together data scientists, analysts, and statisticians to collaborate with clinicians and



researchers. They specialize in research data pipeline development, workflow optimization, advanced data analytics and modeling, population health management, and large-scale bioinformatics.

Clinical Research Services: Houston Methodist supports early phase and investigator-initiated trials and a large portfolio of phase II and IV and industry-sponsored trials. Our translational infrastructure includes an on-site phase I trial unit with 24-hour pharmacodynamics and pharmacokinetics capabilities, early phase and investigator-initiated trial support services, and a centralized clinical trials office, which provides flexible support to investigators running industry-sponsored trials. Resources devoted to bridging preclinical innovations to clinical trials include our GLP facilities, which perform preclinical risk, safety, and efficacy assessment studies in compliance with current FDA guidelines and our cGMP manufacturing facilities, which produce clinical-grade therapeutic materials and custom radiopharmaceuticals for preclinical and first-in-human trials.

Faculty and Research Development Services: From professional services to seed funding and career milestone recognition programs, we continually invest in our faculty and their continued success. Faculty have access to a dedicated liaison to navigate opportunities for research support, education, and professional growth. Faculty also have priority access to a team of research development specialists to assist with grant applications, manuscripts, scientific illustrations, study protocols, and project management. Several courses and interactive workshops developed and facilitated by experienced faculty and scientists to build key competencies in research and education are available. These include skill building in grant proposal development, manuscript writing, giving impactful presentations, and mentorship, as well as cohort-based courses on topics including the fundamentals of clinical research and translation and commercialization.

ACADEMIC AFFILATIONS

Strong academic partnerships bring great value to our communities, both in measurable results today and in greater opportunities for tomorrow. Together, we are creating health science and medical education programs that push the traditional boundaries to meet our changing health care needs. We are training the next generation of health care leadership and all facets of health care professionals to bring the latest advancements in health care to patients around the world. Houston Methodist primary academic affiliate is the top-ranked Weill Cornell Medicine. Houston Methodist also has affiliations with Texas A&M University, Rice University, the University of Houston, and MD Anderson Cancer Center.

Houston Methodist and Weill Cornell Medicine offer joint educational programs, including two PhD programs, a Mentored Clinical Research Training Program, and a fellowship in clinical ethics. Weill Cornell Medicine is among the nation's top-ranked medical and graduate schools, striving for excellence in its education of the world's future health care leaders. Research by faculty and graduate students at Weill Cornell Medicine is collaborative, ground-breaking, and patient-focused.

Other Affiliations

Texas A&M University: The Health Science Center, an independent Texas state agency and academic unit of Texas A&M University, shares mission priorities with Houston Methodist – to develop research and education programs that reflect health care practice in the 21st century, including the impact of technology, patient-empowerment, precision medicine, novel drug delivery systems, and interdisciplinary sciences. Houston Methodist and Texas A&M share joint faculty appointments, research training, and graduate programs, including a unique medical school for engineers named <u>EnMED</u> and an MD-PhD program, which bring creative and innovative predoctoral and medical students in translational medicine to the Texas Medical Center. Houston Methodist also collaborates with Texas A&M's Academy of Physician Scientists program, which is one of only ten programs in the nation funded by the Burroughs Wellcome Fund for innovative approaches to train MD-only medical students, residents, and fellows for careers as physician-scientists. These programs advance the health initiatives of the state of Texas and advance health care for patients around the world.

University of Houston: Founded in 1927, the University of Houston is the city's leading public research university. Houston Methodist and the University of Houston have established an alliance to share resources, educational and research collaborations, and technology transfer practices and offer a joint PhD fellowship in clinical translation. The University of Houston's excellent reputation in science and engineering and its mission to support economic development in Texas through the commercialization of research advances fits with the translational research mission of Houston Methodist.

ABOUT HOUSTON



Houston is not only the hub of the oil and gas industries but a major center of manufacturing health care. The and affordability of this region, located in southeast Texas and home to more than 6.7 million residents in the metro area, consistently attracts new people from across the country and around the world. The Bayou City anchors an international region, boasting one of the youngest, most

racially and ethnically diverse populations in the country. More than a quarter of the population is younger than 20 years old, and the metro area is home to the third-largest Hispanic and third-largest Mexican populations in the country. The region is diverse both politically and culturally. Nearly half of residents speak a language other than English at home, and about 100 languages are spoken in area schools.

Houston is one of a handful of cities in the United States that can boast major symphony, ballet, opera, and theater companies of worldwide acclaim. In fact, the downtown Theater District—which includes the Alley Theater, Jones Hall, the Hobby Center, and the Wortham Center—contains more seating capacity than is available in any other city except New York. Various festivals throughout the year celebrate the heritage and of traditions the international community, including the Original Greek Festival, Fiestas Patrias, the Asian American Festival. Houston International Festival. Other annual events include the International Jazz Festival, Art Car Weekend, and the Texas Renaissance Festival.

In Houston, dining is a pastime, and the region pleases palates with more than 11,000 restaurants. Houston has everything from award-winning fine dining establishments to casual barbecue joints and everything in between. The metro area also offers a variety of international cuisine, including Ethiopian, Mediterranean, Vietnamese, and Indian cuisines. Sports fans have their pick of professional teams to root for, including the Houston Texans (NFL), the Houston Astros (MLB), the Houston Dynamos (MLS), and the Houston Rockets (NBA).

Houston is also home to more than two dozen Fortune 500 companies. The region was ranked among the top manufacturing metro areas in the U.S. Houston is an aerospace hub with NASA's Johnson Space Center.
